Networking with other leaders and contributing to your industry's development through writing and speaking are ways to build your tactical proficiency.



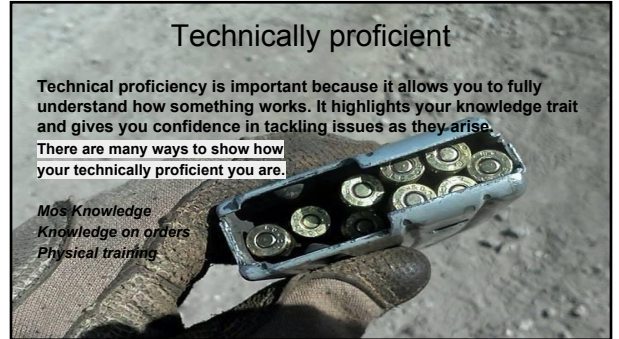
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## Technically proficient
